Born in Cleveland, Ohio in 1923, THEODORE BLOOMFIELD received his musical education at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music and at the Julliard School of Music. After studying conducting with Pierre Monteaux and piano with Claudio Arrau, he was appointed apprentice conductor to George Szell with the Cleveland Orchestra. In 1947 he organized the Cleveland Little

Symphony, composed of 33 members of the Cleveland Orchestra, and served as its conductor until his departure for Europe in 1952. Following his European debut, Bloomfield resided in Italy fulfilling engagements in several European countries for the past three years. Now in his first season as Conductor of the Portland (Oregon) Symphony, Bloomfield has guest conducted numerous orchestras and opera organizations in America.
