ISO's Star Spangled Symphony Returns to White River State Park June 30

One-night-only program brings a patriotic musical tradition back to the downtown park

Guest conductor Alfred Savia and Broadway vocalist Doug LaBrecque join the ISO for a special one-nightonly concert as part of the Harrison College Concert Series at The Farm Bureau Insurance Lawn at White River State Park. Maestro Savia, Music Director of the Evansville Philharmonic, will lead the ISO for an evening of patriotic favorites including America the Beautiful, God Bless America, Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture, marches of John Philip Sousa, and more!

The concert takes place on Friday, June 30. Doors open at 7 p.m., and the performance begins at 8 p.m. Ticket sales begin at 10 a.m. on Monday, April 10 at Ticketmaster.com; prices are as follows:
