Music in My Life: Michelle Black



Born and raised in Dallas, Texas, violinist Michelle Black joined the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra in 2017 to play the great orchestral repertoire. Before coming to Indianapolis, she lived in Houston where she was a substitute with the Houston Symphony Orchestra, Austin Symphony Orchestra, and New World Symphony. She completed her undergraduate studies at the University of Southern California and graduated from Rice University where she received a master's degree. Michelle performed this past summer at the Britt Music Festival and has appeared at the Aspen Music Festival and National Repertory Orchestra.

Tell us about your family.

I come from a musical family. I grew up listening to my mom teaching piano from our home so I was exposed to music from the start. My dad played flute in high school but now does roofing. My sister is very active in the baroque music scene and travels all over the world performing. Her husband plays the baroque trumpet and he recently just finished building his first harpsichord. My brother played cello in high school but pursued a career working with computers.

When did you start to play the violin and what drew you to it?

I began playing the violin when I was six, shortly after quitting the piano. My mom was my piano teacher and I learned most everything by ear. She was not pleased because she wanted me to also be able to read music. That was a struggle for a while, especially bass clef, so violin seemed the most suitable to fit my ability.

What do you enjoy doing when you are not performing?

I enjoy cooking because I enjoy eating! Because I like trying new foods often, I also have conditioned myself to enjoy the gym, especially the sauna. Spending time outdoors is also a daily must, mostly to walk my dog but also to clear my head.

What do you like best about being part of the ISO?

I enjoy being able to play music with friends. I've always gravitated toward playing in orchestra and if it hadn't worked out, I probably wouldn't be playing anymore.

Anything you're looking forward to playing this season?

I look forward to any and every Mahler work we get to perform at the ISO.

Any advice for a young person considering a career in the orchestra?

Record yourself playing, even if you're just hashing out your concerto or excerpts. The challenge is reviewing it because there's no denying what you hear, good or bad. Don't get discouraged when something doesn't work out in your favor. You really never know what the person listening is looking for.

Tell me something about you that most people don't know and wouldn't expect.

I wanted to be a dental hygienist if music didn't work out.

What do you like best about AES Indiana Yuletide Celebration?

The decorations and the sparkles! It's so joyful and it's really the most wonderful time of the year!

Musicians Around Town

Violinist Peter Vickery, along with retired ISO violinists Yefim Pastukh, Vladimir Krakovich, and Konstantin Umansky, will perform a number of free holiday concerts in libraries across Indianapolis from November 26 to December 15. Musicians Mary Anne Dell'Aquila, Yeajin Kim (violins), Yang Guo (viola), and Nicholas Donatelle (cello) will play a noontime concert of holiday music at Eskenazi Hospital on December 14. The series is sponsored by ISO board member and Program Note Annotator Marianne Tobias.

Assistant Principal Oboe Roger Roe is playing on a woodwind faculty recital on the Sundays at Auer Hall series at IU on March 5, 2023. He has been on faculty for 21 years with the IU Jacobs School of Music.

Principal Tuba Tony Kniffen is teaching at Butler University as an Instructor of Tuba and Euphonium and also teaching at Noblesville High School and Carmel High School. On May 21, 2023, Kniffen will be performing in the world premiere of James Beckel's Concerto for Tuba and Wind Ensemble with the Indiana Wind Symphony. Beckel retired as Principal Trombone at the ISO in 2018.

Principal Horn Rob Danforth is serving a year as a board member of the Town Run Trail Park Advisory Council. The council advises and guides Indianapolis Parks and Recreation as to how to best maintain and improve TRTP as a premiere mountain bike-focused trail park in Indianapolis.

In July, Acting Associate Principal Violist Amy Kniffen visited Kirklin Public Library to narrate *A Symphony of Whales* by Steven Schuch along with playing her viola. Kniffen's programming is intended to encourage children to pursue music and learn to play different instruments. Kniffen is also an adjunct professor of viola at Anderson University and the founder of The Sassy Violist.

Violinist Li Li and Principal Contrabass Ju-Fang Liu performed duos on September 19 at the IU Health Cancer Center as part of the Center's Health & Harmony program.

Concertmaster Kevin Lin performed the national anthem on October 19 for the season opener of the Indiana Pacers.

Several ISO musicians including Stephen Hawkey (cello), Mark Ortwein (bassoon), and Jennifer Christen-Howlett (oboe) performed on October 24 as part of the Faculty Artist Concert Series at the University of Indianapolis.

On October 30, several ISO musicians worked with the IU Medical School Orchestra as they prepared for their fall concert, including Mary Anne Dell'Aquila (violin), Emilee Drumm (viola), Jill Boaz (horn), Conrad Jones (trumpet), and Joseph Aumann (trombone).

Background

AES Indiana *Yuletide Celebration* has a rich 36-year history. Prior to the existence of this beloved family tradition, the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra filled its December calendar with everything from Handel's *Messiah* and Bach's *Christmas Oratorio* to *The Nutcracker* with Butler University and holiday-themed pops shows.


In 1986, the ISO changed gears completely and became the first American orchestra to create an original Broadway-style holiday extravaganza with singing, dancing, puppetry, and many more theatrical elements. The *Yuletide Celebration* started small, with only eight performances in the first year, and it has grown to be the largest orchestra-produced holiday presentation of its kind in North America. The ISO now presents more than 25 performances attracting nearly 40,000 people each December.



Frankie Moreno

Host

This is singer Frankie Moreno's second time hosting the AES Indiana *Yuletide Celebration* having been the host in 2019. Many noted celebrities have hosted the AES Indiana *Yuletide Celebration*: veteran comedienne and star of stage, screen, and television Kaye Ballard (1991); 1981 Miss America and host of the Discovery Channel's *Home Matters* Susan Powell (1993); two-time Tony Award-winning actress Judy Kaye (1994–95); longtime star as "The Phantom" in Broadway's production of *The Phantom of the Opera*, Ted Keegan (1999); acclaimed singer and actress who portrayed Dr. Josie Conklin on the ABC Television's daytime soap opera




By the Numbers

There's a lot that goes into the show! The Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra's holiday production of the AES Indiana *Yuletide Celebration* includes:

- 52 vocalists, dancers, actors, and specialized performers in the company
- 🌺 28 production staff and crew
- 12 tons of scenery and light grids
- 3,500 different points of light within the scenery via fiber-optic lighting
- 310 theatrical lighting fixtures, 43 computer-controlled moving lights, and 60 color-changing lights
- ₹ 350+ costumes and 120 props
- **96** microphones
- More than 2,600 batteries to power the artists' microphones during the course of the 26-performance run
- 🌺 **7,908** LED lights used in the show
- **32** snow machines
- 325 rehearsal hours put in by director/choreographer Jen Ladner, the production staff, and the AES Indiana Yuletide Celebration cast
- 141 hours for our stagehands and production team to load in the set; prep, distribute, and tune sound gear; hang and focus the lights; and get the stage ready to shine!

Conductors

The first conductor for Yuletide Celebration was longtime Oklahoma City Philharmonic Music Director Joel Levine (1986–90). Following Maestro Levine were Indianapolis Opera Artistic Director James Caraher (1991), Boston Pops Music Director Keith Lockhart (1992-93), and current ISO Principal Pops Conductor Jack Everly (1994-present). Another noted member of the Yuletide Celebration artistic team was Broadway choreographer Mercedes Ellington, granddaughter of famed bandleader Duke Ellington, who choreographed elaborate dance elements for the show for 10 years (1991-2000). This year's choreographer and stage director, Jennifer Ladner, started with the show as Dance Captain, and was then promoted to Assistant Choreographer shortly after. Jennifer then moved into the role of Choreographer and eventually into Director/ Choreographer, a title she holds to this day.



Jack Everly, Conductor



Jack Everly is the Principal Pops Conductor of the Indianapolis and Baltimore Symphony Orchestras, Naples Philharmonic Orchestra, and the National Arts Centre Orchestra (Ottawa). He has conducted the Los Angeles

Philharmonic at the Hollywood Bowl, the San Francisco Symphony, the New York Pops at Carnegie Hall, and the Seattle Symphony.

As music director of the National Memorial Day Concert and *A Capitol Fourth* on PBS, Everly proudly leads the National Symphony Orchestra in these patriotic celebrations on the West Lawn of the U.S. Capitol. These concerts attract hundreds of thousands of attendees on the lawn and the broadcasts reach millions of viewers, making them some of the highest-rated programs on PBS.

Everly recently extended his contract with the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra through 2026, when he will assume the role of Principal Pops Conductor Emeritus. He will continue to be the music director of the AES Indiana *Yuletide Celebration*, the nation's largest

symphonic holiday production in the country. He led the ISO in its first Pops recording, *Yuletide Celebration*, Volume One. Some of his other recordings include *In The Presence* featuring the Czech Philharmonic and Daniel Rodriguez; Sandi Patty's *Broadway Stories*; the soundtrack to Disney's *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*; and *Everything's Coming Up Roses*: *The Overtures of Jule Styne*.

Originally appointed by Mikhail Baryshnikov, Everly was conductor of the esteemed American Ballet Theatre for 14 years, where he served as music director. In addition to his ABT tenure, he teamed with Marvin Hamlisch on Broadway shows that Hamlisch scored. He conducted Carol Channing hundreds of times in *Hello, Dolly!* in two separate Broadway productions.

Everly, a Hoosier native and graduate of the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University, is a recipient of the 2015 Indiana Historical Society Living Legends Award and holds an Honorary Doctorate of Arts from Franklin College in his home state of Indiana. He has been a proud resident of the Indianapolis community for more than 20 years and would like to thank his colleagues of ISO musicians for their continued commitment to excellence and for filling our community with music all year long.

Frankie Moreno, Host



Singer, songwriter, and musician **Frankie Moreno** is entertaining audiences from coast to coast with his own brand of genre-blurring rock-'n'-roll.

Reaching millions of record sales worldwide, Frankie continues to write and release new

music consistently. Since April 2020 alone, Frankie reached the #1 spot on the iTunes charts a record-setting 67 times with new singles, and in 2019 made music history becoming the only artist to have six albums reach a Top-10 spot on the Billboard charts in a 12 month period.



As a touring artist, Frankie has traveled internationally with Sugarland, Billy Currington, and wrote Air Supply's #8 Billboard Top-40 hit *Dance With Me* while touring as their Musical Director. In 2018, Frankie created a Symphony concert where he has performed his original music with the nation's premiere orchestras.

Frankie Moreno commands audiences around the world with his highly contagious music and playful stage antics. His songs are cleverly crafted and his musicianship virtuoso. He is unquestionably a unique artist and all around talent who puts his heart and soul into his music.

Mary, Maggy, and Marta Moipei are triplets from Nairobi, Kenya, and currently reside in the U.S.

Their musical journey began in Kenya Music Festival competitions with their sister Serafina. They were awarded 1st place honors for four consecutive years.

Their success has enabled them to showcase their talents to national and international audiences, taking part in various cultural festivals and conventions in Tanzania, Uganda, Canada, Venezuela, China, and the U.S.

After a successful tour of South Korea, representing their country during the Young People's Festival (YoPeFe), the sisters, at the age of 12, were appointed Kenya's first ever UNICEF Child Ambassadors. Through their musical talents they championed girl-child empowerment, education, and alternative rites of passage.

Their notability grew in the Kenyan musical scene, and they were appointed as the Kenyan Musical Ambassadors to attend the Second African Cultural Festival in Caracas, Venezuela. They performed in various historic theatres and opera houses including the Teatro Municipal de Caracas to sold out audiences.

They were awarded the Head of State Commendation by the President of Kenya, His Excellency Mwai Kibaki, in recognition of their outstanding contribution to the music industry and the nation.

Their album *In the Land of the Lion* won the 2011 Best of Africa category at the prestigious South Africa Broadcasting Corporation Awards (SABC) held in Durban, South Africa. The sisters have performed sold-out concerts, presenting an eclectic mix of their own arrangements of Broadway tunes, jazz hits, sacred pieces, and Kenyan folk songs.

In 2017, they were featured in their first professional opera, *Speed Dating Tonight* with the Alamo City Opera company. The composer Michael Ching wrote an original piece for the singers, titled, "If not now when?"

Additional highlights include singing "The Star-Spangled Banner" to thousands of NBA fans at a San Antonio Spurs playoff game; presenting a program for the president of Kenya in the iconic Rainbow Room at Rockefeller Center; and performing with the San Antonio Symphony at their Holiday Pops concert singing an arrangement of "Let it Snow," specially commissioned for the trio.

Moipei opened Amarillo Opera's 2019 "Black History Month" concert series, receiving rave reviews for their performance. The trio performed a highly successful one-month tour of British Columbia, Canada.

Moipei made their New York City debut at the Mabel Mercer Gala at Jazz at Lincoln Center Rose Hall in October 2021. The following week they made their debut at the internationally renowned Birdland Theater.





When the curtain rises on the AES Indiana *Yuletide Celebration*, an enchanting holiday wonderland is revealed to the audience. The music soars, the dresses sparkle, and the sounds of the chorus fill Hilbert Circle Theatre. What the audience may not realize is that hundreds of hours have been spent behind the scenes to make sure that everything looks as vibrant and magical as possible, and that's where the lighting design team comes in.

Lighting Designer Stuart Duke, Associate Lighting Designer Travis McHale, and Lighting Programmer Topher Stumreiter are the wizards who program and place every single light and cue for the entire show. Stuart has worked on every *Yuletide Celebration* except the first one, making this season his 35th. Stuart has designed lighting for dozens of large-scale shows during his career, but he says that *Yuletide Celebration* is the most intensive and complicated show that he works on.

"It's grown so massively in size and scope over the years," he says. "There are so many lights and smart lights and moving lights and it includes an amazing amount of technology."

Thanks to technology, Stuart and his team are able to start programming the lights for the show long before they arrive in Indianapolis the day after Thanksgiving.

Cameras in the rehearsal room record each

practice, allowing the design team to start working weeks in advance. Stuart, Travis, and Topher have also been working together on *Yuletide* for four years, which is a great asset.

"The week before the show opens is so compressed and fast," explains Stuart. "But my team and the entire creative team and the performers are such professionals that the show is polished and ready to go by opening night. It's a testament to the talent of everyone involved and their ability to work well together quickly."

Prior to their arrival in Indianapolis, Travis works with Stuart to prepare the light plot, which is essentially a blueprint for the stage electricians to show where every light should hang, what kind it is, what color, and to make sure it can easily be controlled once the light cues are written into the show. More than 300 lighting fixtures are used in the show with more than 250 lighting cues.

"I view my role as allowing the designer—Stuart—to think about communicating with the creative team and 'painting with light' as he writes the cues," says Travis, who is in his eighth *Yuletide Celebration* this year. "There is so much technology and thousands of bits of information that are in constant flux to track, so a major task of mine is documenting all of this so that the show can run and look the same night after night."

Once Stuart and Travis have completed their work, Topher jumps in to provide the extra "holiday sparkle," as he puts it, by making the lights dance and come to life. About a month before the show opens, Topher preps and folds in new equipment and technology to the lighting design. Once he arrives at Hilbert, he works with the lighting rig and starts to check the preproduction that he's been working on at home.

"I love working with the lighting team," he says. "The three of us have a good working rapport and have built trust over the years so that it's truly a collaborative process."

Once the three of them are satisfied with the lighting and the programming, they hand it over to the talented team of electricians and stagehands at Hilbert Circle Theatre to run and maintain the show for the month. After opening night, Stuart, Travis, and Topher pack up and head to their next gig. But all three men talk about the joy of working together and the magic that happens during each Yuletide Celebration.

"The lighting should carry the energy of the show," says Stuart.
"The show is born of the music, but the lighting and music are wed to each other in a marvelous way. And that's what's truly fun about *Yuletide*."
